The National Network of Libraries of Medicine (NNLM), a program of the National Library of Medicine (NLM), has expanded its partnership with SciStarter. In 2018, the two organizations worked collaboratively to promote Citizen Science Day in libraries, to

Through citizen science and crowdsourcing, NNLM can engage communities in addressing societal needs and accelerating biomedical science, technology, and innovation. Community participation in the research process also builds trust between NNLM and the communities that we serve. NNLM has partnered with the NIH *All of Us* Research Program to highlight citizen science as a way to increase the involvement of people living in the U.S. in scientific research as a way to reduce some of the barriers between health researchers and research and the public. Such collaborations between communities and researchers build capacity to address problems and meet research goals. The partnership also aims to foster better understanding of health data and its uses in this increasingly data-driven world. NLM provides access to a variety of resources for basic health, environmental health, and genetics that can support Citizen Science outreach efforts in your community.
