• Candy constellations

Materials:

- Sheet of black construction paper
- Bag of small candies, such as M&Ms
- Light-colored crayon
- (optional) star stickers
- Slowly drop 5 to 10 candies onto the black construction paper.
- Replace each candy with a star sticker, or draw a small star in the place of each candy.
- Create your constellation.

• Draw Your Thoughts

- Ask the children to think about the stories they just heard. Invite them to illustrate the story — or one aspect of the story, or to create and illustrate their "own" story. Consider including a variety of materials available such as paint, tissue paper, glue, scissors, etc., so the children can make mosaics, mobiles, or sculptures to illustrate the stories or make constellations.
